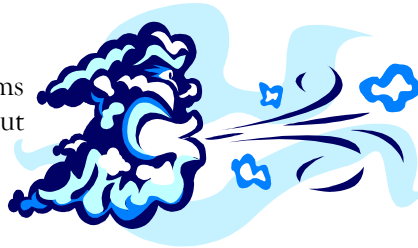

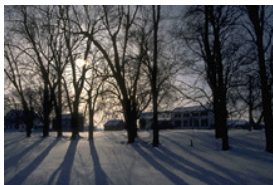

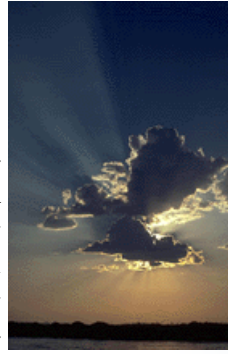
Winter Blues With Silver Lined Clouds!
